

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 114, "VEGETATION" AND CHAPTER 98, "SUBDIVISION"**

**Whereas,** The City Council has determined that landscaping on private property may cause a hazard by obstructing the line of sight of motorists and bicyclists entering intersection; and

**Whereas,** the City Council has determined that it is necessary for the City to regulate landscaping on private property to insure that motorists and bicyclists have a clear line of sight when approaching an intersection.

**Now Therefore, Be It Ordained** by the City Council of the City of Rolling Meadows, Illinois, as follows:

**Section One:** Chapter 114, Section 114-29. Definitions "Sight Triangle" is hereby repealed and replaced with "*Sight Triangle* means a triangular area at the intersection of two streets or a street and a driveway, the hypotenuse of which establishes a safe line of sight for a motorist, cyclist or pedestrian. The sight triangle shall be determined per Section 114-37(b)(1)".

**Section Two:** Chapter 98, Section 98-162(h) is hereby repealed and replaced with the following: "Surface grading at street intersections shall be such as to permit unrestricted vision within the sight triangles as determined per Chapter 114, Section 114-37(b)(1)".

**Section Three:** Chapter 98, Section 98-162(m), the row titled "Minimum Clear Sight Distance", the words "REFER to IDOT" shall be repealed and replaced with "per Chapter 114, Section 114-37(b)(1) for local streets and per IDOT standards for arterial streets".

**Section Four:** This Ordinance shall be printed and published in pamphlet form by order of the City Council of the City of Rolling Meadows.


**Section Five:** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval as provided by law.


