

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 2 “ADMINISTRATION”
OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES**

WHEREAS, on March 26, 2019, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 19-R-52 to submit to the electors within the City of Rolling Meadows a referenda question to limit the terms of the alderman elected to the City Council to two (2) consecutive four (4) year terms commencing with the Consolidated Election in April 2021; and

WHEREAS, the referenda question was submitted to the electors of the City of Rolling Meadows at the March 17, 2020 Primary Election; and

WHEREAS, more of the electors of the City of Rolling Meadows voted in favor of the referenda question than voted against the referenda question; and

WHEREAS, although the results of the votes in favor of the referenda question are self-enabling to establish the term limits on alderman elected commencing with the 2021 Consolidated Election the City Council has determined to codify the Code of Ordinances to reflect the votes in favor of the referenda.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Rolling Meadows, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION ONE: Section 2-37 (b) of Chapter 2 “Administration”, “Election and terms; legislative functions generally” of the Code of Ordinances is hereby repealed and replaced with the following:

- (b) Effective with the aldermanic election of April, 2021, the number of consecutive four-year terms that one person may serve as alderman is limited to two.

SECTION TWO: This Ordinance shall be printed and published in pamphlet form by order of the City Council.

SECTION THREE: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage approval and publication as provided by law.


