Meridian Banquets: A Multi-Generational Commitment to Exceptional Service

As recipient of multiple “Best of” awards presented by *The Knot* and *WeddingWire* – online sites used by couples searching for the ideal venue for their wedding receptions – it’s no surprise that Meridian Banquet & Conference Center is, at its core, a family business.

The nearly 50,000 sq. ft. facility at 1701 West Algonquin Road in Rolling Meadows has been owned and operated by the Apostolou family since 2006. Jim and Vickie, and their three children (Tina, Bill, and Steve – who run the business), have hosted thousands of events, including weddings, corporate parties, meetings/expositions, and holiday brunches since then.

“Our family had been involved in the banquet business since 1992. We were able to lean on that experience and apply it to the Meridian on day one,” Tina explained.

Greek Origins to the American Dream

Jim Apostolou emigrated from Greece to Canada in 1968 to seek a better life.

His first jobs in the hospitality industry included mopping floors and washing pots in a hotel restaurant kitchen.

“I didn’t speak English well enough to wash dishes,” he recalled with a smile. “They put me on pots instead.”

By 1974, Jim and two of his brothers owned a Greek restaurant near Chicago’s Portage Park neighborhood. The success of that small restaurant was parlayed into a wholesale gyros distribution business in 1976 that counted restaurants across the country as its customers.

As the 1990s dawned, the Apostolous had also expanded into real estate. In fact, the family’s portfolio includes the recently renovated Squire Court Shopping Center on Plum Grove Road in Rolling Meadows.

Although still in school at the time, Tina, Bill, and Steve all pitched in to help the banquet business succeed. The experience they gained while growing

It serves more than 150,000 people per year by hosting everything from awards dinners to holiday brunches. While weddings comprise a majority of its business, the facility also hosts functions for many of Rolling Meadows' largest companies.

It offers five large event rooms with sound-proof walls, elaborate high ceilings, an elegant foyer with abundant natural lighting, and a dedicated service team committed to achieving customers' highest expectations.

"We don't take shortcuts when it comes to customer service," Tina explained. "We find and retain talented people who are committed to exceptional service and put them in position to succeed. They become part of the family."

"Most of our employees have been with us for many years – some were here before us," Jim added.

Success in any industry comes from consistently meeting and exceeding customers' expectations. The hospitality sector, in particular, can be particularly relentless in the social media era: just one sub-par review could potentially damage a business' reputation.

"Online reviews are how people find facilities for their events," Tina said. "The awards we've garnered from *The Knot*, *WeddingWire*, and other online event platforms help us showcase our commitment to those we serve. The key is providing great experiences to everyone who comes into our facility – from the bride and groom to the DJ they hire for their reception."

Supports City-Sponsored Events

Local military veterans have been beneficiaries of those "great experiences" since 2003. Meridian Banquets is the site of the City's annual Veterans Dinner, held the Friday evening before its yearly Memorial Day observance.

In addition, City planners moved this year's Business & Community Showcase to Meridian Banquets to benefit from the facility's reputation for hosting high-end conferences and meetings (see page 2 for details).

"We feel it is important to support our local community," Tina added. "The Meridian's relationship with the Veterans Dinner dates back more than 15 years. We are proud to have helped continue the tradition."

Natural Gas Tax Generates Expanded Revenues for Infrastructure Improvements

In line with a growing trend among area municipalities, City Council in 2018 approved a five cent per-therm surcharge on customers' gas bills to generate revenue specifically for annual roadway and infrastructure improvements. Previously, that funding had been collected by selling vehicle stickers to motorists with cars registered in Rolling Meadows.

Key benefits of moving to a natural gas use tax as a funding mechanism for infrastructure maintenance activities include:

- **Increased revenue** – City officials expect to generate additional revenue that will allow them to invest more effectively in local infrastructure projects.
- **More efficient operations** – Monthly fees are collected by the gas company and passed directly to the City, which improves internal operating efficiencies.
- **Improved customer service** – This approach also eliminates the costly, time-consuming processes formerly required to



implement the annual vehicle sticker program. This allows City staff members to focus more of their energies on serving business and residential customers.

The natural gas tax took effect last December. Customers' monthly Nicor Gas bills reflect the new utility fee, which is based on usage. *(Note: It is up to customers to complete their own cost estimates, based on the number of therms used each month or on an annual basis.)*
