POWER OF ATTORNEY AND SHORT-TERM GUARDIANSHIP CLINIC INFO

What are Power of Attorney documents?

A Power of Attorney (POA) document allows a person to name an “Agent” to help with medical and financial decisions in the event of incapacity. Anyone over the age of 18 should have the power of attorney for health care and property executed.

What is Short-term Guardianship?

Short-term guardianships are a means for parents to name a legal guardian of their minor children in the event they are unable to care for the child. This is important if a parent is traveling out of town, having a medical procedure, is detained/incarcerated, or simply unavailable for a specified duration of time. The short-term guardianship does not require a court appearance and is effective for up to a year.

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
